California Assembly Bill 368

- Existing law requires the governing board of a community college district participating in a CCAP partnership to exempt special part-time students from certain fee requirements...would expressly authorize courses to be offered at the community college campus or the participating high school campus. The bill would require a community college district to assign priority for enrollment and course registration to a pupil seeking to enroll in a community college course that is required for the pupil's CCAP partnership program. The bill would also exempt all pupils seeking to enroll in a community college course that is required for the pupil's CCAP partnership program from specified fee requirements.
- This bill would specify groups of students who may be considered "underrepresented in higher education" for these purposes.... Existing law requires, for each CCAP partnership agreement, the affected community college district and school district or county office of education to report annually to the office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges specified information....This bill would require, on or before May 1 of each year, the chancellor to aggregate that information and submit a report of that information to the Legislature, the Director of Finance, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

AB 368 (Currently Active)

- Further sets the stage for the Chancellor's goal of enrolling 250,000 9th grade students into CCC during their freshman year
- Outlines/defines "underrepresented in higher education" definition to more easily enroll these students across the state. Earlier versions of the CCAP language focused on "high achieving" students language.

California Assembly Bill 1342

Existing law establishes the California College Promise,...to provide funding...to each community college meeting prescribed requirements. Existing law authorizes a community college to use that funding to waive some or all of the fees for 2 academic years for first-time community college students and returning community college students, as defined...as specified, and who complete and submit either a Free Application for Federal Student Aid or a California Dream Act application...

This bill would require that a student who enrolls in community college, after having enrolled in community college as a specified special part- or full-time student or dual enrollment high school pupil, is a first-time student for purposes of receiving this fee waiver.

AB 1342 (Currently Active, however)

- Special Admits/Dual Enrollments are still FTF even though they may have completed units while still in high school via Dual Enrollment
- Mt. SAC does not use AB 19 (California College Promise Fee Waiver Funds) for fee waivers, so it doesn't apply to us.
