Concept Check: ～てほしい／～ないでほしい

To describe what you want someone to do or not to do in Japanese, you can use ～てほしい or ～ないでほしい.

When using ～てほしい, you will conjugate the verb into て-form and use the particle に to show who you want to do the action.

Ex. 私はルームメイトに皿(さら)を洗(あら)ってほしいです。I want my roommate to wash the dishes.

The format is similar when using ～ないでほしい, however you must remember to conjugate the verb into the negative form.

Ex. 私はルームメイトにうるさくしないでほしいです。I do not want my roommate to be noisy.
